New Course Development

Georgia Southern University 2022 Introduction to Esports The rapid growth of esports in all sectors of recreation provision requires aspiring recreation professionals to have a deep understanding of the current technological developments and trends in the recreation industry. This course is designed to explore the history and development of esports, discuss global issues and current trends, and expose students to hardware, software, and equipment commonly used in the global recreation industry to attract participants and provide quality technology-based experiences. Golf Operations 2018 Provides students with a basic understanding of operations, planning, and management related to the golf industry. Students will engage in a historical examination of the golf industry, including the sociological, economic, and psychological, benefits of participation, as well as the political and technological considerations effecting the industry in modern society. 2018 Resort and Commercial Recreation Management Provides students with an overview of the resort and commercial recreation segment of the recreation industry. Students will gain an understanding of the organizations who facilitate recreation experiences, economic implications, management and programming techniques, and current events effecting the industry. 2018 Campus and Community Recreation Provides students with an understanding of the operation and management of campus and community recreation agencies. Students will gain an understanding of the physical, social, psychological, and economic impacts of recreation programs on college and university campuses and communities. They will also examine managerial issues and programming strategies within the two areas. 2018 Youth Sports Programming Explores the history, administration, programming, and current issues related to youth sports. Students will gain an understanding of planning and administrative strategies to deliver youth sport activities within public, private, and non-profit settings. Youngstown State University 2016 Recreation and Leisure in Our Lives Addresses issues related to choices made by individuals and society in relation to leisure. Content covered hospitality and tourism as related to Recreation and Leisure and impact on personal and collective well-being. Middle Tennessee State University 2014 Legal Issues in Leisure, Sport, and Tourism Studies Concentrates on legal issues relevant to sport, recreation, and leisure services.

The course provides students with an understanding of a broad range of legal

issues pertaining to all areas of specialization and the practical application of the topics discussed. The goal of the course is to help students better understand the

law to serve participants, protect the organization and employees, and avoid or reduce the probability of litigation.
